From Our Spiritual Leader, Rabbi Mark Elber

On Friday, May 10, I drove through the more rural sections of eastern Long Island on my way to the ferry from Orient Point to New London, Connecticut on a beautiful, temperate morning. From the sunny deck of the vessel ferrying us across the Sound, I watched Long Island recede in the background and New England loom ever larger. That evening's service was my first as your incoming rabbi and was a very exciting moment for me. That Shabbat's Torah portion was the first portion of the fourth book of the Torah, known as "Bemidbar" in Hebrew and "Numbers" in English.

Bemidbar means "in the desert" or "in the wilderness" and describes a great period of transition for our ancestors during which they are evolving and preparing themselves for entrance into the Land of Israel. The people are coalescing as a group. It felt like a very appropriate Parashah (Torah portion) because we are beginning a journey together in which we all play a part. A community is like a living organism, a body, in which every component plays a vital role, every person counts. In terms of "numbers," on Friday evening we did very well too.

I know that Temple Beth El has not had a regular Shabbat morning service in quite a while, but in addition to our bi-monthly visits through June, once July begins, Shabbat morning services will once again become a regular feature of the life of the synagogue.

A few nights after returning to Huntington, Long Island, Shoshana and I led a Tikkun Leil Shavuot, a study session on the first night of Shavuot, at our local Conservative Synagogue. The tradition of staying up the first night of Shavuot to study began in northern Israel in the beautiful mountain town of Tzfat during the 16th Century. Though the practice began among the community of kabbalists, (Jewish mystics who studied Kabbalah), over the centuries the custom has become widespread throughout the Jewish world. The topic of our Tikkun was the evolving nature of Judaism in North America. We were inspired by a recent book edited by Rabbi Sidney Schwartz called "Jewish Megatrends: Charting the Course of the American Jewish Future." The book discusses the changing face of American synagogues and offers many insights for those of us concerned with the health and growth of our communities. The topics we read about and discussed ranged from Jewish education (the shift from continuity to meaning); the importance of immersive experiences; and the quests of today's Jews for spirituality, authenticity, and social justice. Shoshana and I hope that as a community we will study, discuss, and implement various programs that will enhance the vibrancy of our prayer and communal life together at Temple Beth El. With great anticipation, I look forward to our future together.

It was a sunny afternoon in May when a gathering of loyal friends and proud family members walked into the Venus de Milo



to honor Dr. Irving Fradkin and his loving wife Charlotte, who was marking her birthday. Numbers, dates and long lists of accomplishments no longer count, everyone understands that by now. All that matters is that the billions of dollars of scholarships given to the millions of hopeful graduates added up to countless successful careers. Irving was there to welcome each guest with his trademark "Hi ya" and sweet Charlotte was by his side as always. I even got a shot of them kissing! Local

politicians presented awards to add to Irving's ever-increasing collection - the walls in their den are completely covered with plaques at this point but he gladly accepted the day's additions - always with a smile and a soft spoken, gracious thank you. Each speaker recalled being invited to the Fradkin home - early in their careers - anxious to learn about whatever wisdom or guidance that their host could offer them. Congressman Joseph Kennedy took the spotlight. A tall, handsome redhead with Kennedy style, he worked the room with finesse and spoke to the honoree with the respect that was due him. I got the feeling that Irving would have a lot to say to the young congressman later on.

Irving's favorite topics - how to heal America, improve foreign relations, fix the education systems, clean up politics, solve the Middle East's problems, find jobs for people, reduce the future prison population...he stays the course - his lifetime mission is to repair the world - tikkun olam.

Judge Joseph Macy, a grateful scholarship recipient himself, was the keynote speaker. He told us that because he is lawyer, he reads things carefully and he noticed that the program booklet stated that the day's event was to mark the "active" retirement of Dr. Irving Fradkin. Judge Macy read between the lines. What do you think?

Theodore Herzl

(May 2, 1860 – July 3, 1904) Austria - Hungary Journalist – Father of Modern Political Zionism

Born to assimilated Ashkenazi Jews in Pest, Hungary, Herzl had minimal interest in religion as a child. In 1878 he studied law in Vienna and after a brief legal career he devoted himself to journalism and literature. It was the rise to power of the anti-Semitic Karl Lueger in Vienna in 1895 that led Herzl to believe that anti-Semitism could not be defeated, but only avoided, and that the way to avoid it would be to establish a Jewish state. In his book Der Judenstaat (The Jewish State), published in 1896 to acclaim and controversy, he states, "The Jews who will it shall achieve their state. We shall live at last as free men on our own soil, and in our own homes peacefully die. The world will be liberated by our freedom, enriched by our wealth, magnified by our greatness. And whatever we attempt there for our own benefit will redound mightily and beneficially to the good of all mankind."
