A NEW LIGHT—AND MOVIES! AT TEMPLE BETH EL

Have you heard the buzz about the Temple Beth El Cinema? Our April film was *Defiance*, the true story of the Bielski brothers who fought as Jewish partisans, saving over 1,200 Jews in the forests of Poland during WWII. May's movie was *The Other Son (Le Fils de l'Autre)*—although at the time of this writing, it has not shown yet. Nevertheless, upon previewing it recently, it took my breath away.

The story is an ancient one: two babies accidentally switched at birth, belonging to two rival peoples. During the first Gulf War, as SCUD missiles fell on Haifa, two babies that had just been delivered—one Palestinian and one Jewish Israeli were hurriedly swept out of the hospital nursery and taken to an emergency underground shelter. Eighteen years later the mistake is discovered: in the chaos, the babies were given to the wrong mothers. The Palestinian grows up "Jewish" in Tel Aviv, a creative dreamer and musician, so unlike his caring but high-powered Israeli Air Force careerofficer father. The Israeli boy grows up "Muslim" on the West Bank; he has French relatives and has just finished high school in Paris, returning home to his family to celebrate his success; he plans to go to university and then to medical school.

How could two families bear news like this? The child that you raised and loved, projected your dreams onto for 18 years—suddenly you find out that he is not yours, and worse—that he is the son of a people whom you fear, resent, and distrust?! If you missed it, I don't want to tell you too much. Let me just say that this film delivers some much-needed uplift during a time when we seem to be bombarded by catastrophes around the world. Some of these are the result of bigotry and violence, causing the largest refugee crises since World War II, terrorist-driven wars across Africa, the Middle East, South Asia, and the Ukraine. Some are natural disasters, such as the earthquakes in Nepal, leaving over 8,000 dead. We face environmental crises caused by depleting natural resources, and in the process fouling our ecosystems. And then there are the apparent "acts of nature" such as the latest round of tornados across the Midwest. (Although there is not yet conclusive evidence that a warming planet is responsible for an increase in "super tornadoes," many climatologists suspect human-induced changes in atmospheric conditions as a factor.) Who can forget the violence and devastation that raged for several days and nights just weeks ago in Baltimore, or, more recently, a fatal Amtrak derailment between Philadelphia and New York? One feels overwhelmed. You can donate to organizations that help refugees, foster understanding amongst peoples, protect the environment, work for justice, provide relief to victims of earthquakes, famines, tornadoes, rising waters, droughts...but there is no end. We succumb to compassion-fatigue.

This is why I loved The Other Son. My instinctual response to all this bad news-and perhaps yours as well—is that I have to do something to try and "fix" all these problems. As privileged, educated inhabitants of the First World, we are the ones whose responsibility it is to hand down to our children and grandchildren a world that will continue to be livable for generations to come. But in The Other Son it is primarily the children (young adults) who bring about the story's "redemption." I don't mean to say that we can stop worrying about ISIS or California's drought, thinking "The younger generation will figure it all out." But when you see how-at least in this screenwriter's and director's vision—these young people from different cultures are able to overcome the prejudice they have grown up with, to reach across seemingly unbridgeable chasms with sincerity and love, it gives you hope. Surprise! Sometimes, even though they are not the ones responsible for creating the problems, our young people can succeed where we have failed in undoing wrongs that the parents have committed.

Unlike the story of *Defiance*, *The Other Son* is fictional—and yet it speaks profoundly about the difficulties between peoples, and about a love that does not depend on blood or DNA, and most of all, about the ability of a younger generation to see the world in a new light. We desperately need "new light" these days. While it is important for young people to honor the wisdom of their elders, it is also important for the "elders" who still hold the reins of power at most of our institutions to listen to the voices of the young. The world is changing so fast! One of our prayers pleads, Let a new light shine upon Zion, and may we all soon be worthy of its light. With all of the distressing headlines one encounters these days, it is good to chant this prayer—not just for "Zion," but for the whole world, and to remember that in order to be worthy of this "new light," we have to open our hearts and minds to it. This is what art, especially film, does so wellhelping us to see and feel something that we otherwise might never have felt or seen. This, too, is a kind of *Torah*. Please join us at a viewing soon!

SUMMER BLOCKBUSTERS AT THE TBE CINEMA!

Note: for the summer, we have changed our "Sunday afternoon" movies to Wednesday evenings—so you can spend your Sundays at the beach! All showings below will be held at 6:30 pm in the TBE Vestry.

Wed., June 24th: **The Frisco Kid**: Simultaneously hilarious and uplifting, The Frisco Kid is a great under-the-radar "Jewish cowboy" comedy from 1979; directed by Robert Aldrich, starring Gene Wilder as a Polish rabbi traveling to San Francisco and Harrison Ford as a bank robber who befriends him.

Wed., July 22nd: **A Time of Favor**: Directed by Joseph Cedar, *Hahesder* (the film's Hebrew name) came out in 2000, winning six Israeli Academy Awards (including Best Picture). It is a thriller about the near-catastrophe that ensues when a young soldier who is the star pupil in his National Religious Zionist yeshiva takes his rabbi's words too literally and hatches a plot to blow up the Dome of the Rock, hoping to pave the way for the Third Temple and the Coming of the Messiah.

Wed. Aug. 26th: **A Cantor's Tale** (2005): "Erik Greenberg Anjou's documentary about Brooklynborn and -raised cantor Jack Mendelson is both a biographical portrait and an exploration of the tradition of Jewish liturgical music in America... Mendelson's love of *chazzanut*, and of music in general...drives this engaging film; anyone familiar with the power of music to transcend language...will find his passion irresistible."--Maitland McDonagh, TV Guide
