A message from our Spiritual Leader,
Cantor Shoshana Brown

“Our Envious Spiritual Technology”

As I write these words, not yet quite halfway through the month of May, it has been seven days since my mother's death. It feels strange to be writing a bulletin letter during this period, when, had my mother been Jewish, and had she been buried within the standard 24 to 48 hours of her passing, I would be sitting *shiva*. Instead, I am in a strange period of waiting (for the funeral, which will be on May 23rd), and of preparation. I have a checklist of duties that I am trying to dispatch so that after Mark, Lev and I return from the funeral in Virginia, I can finally *sit*, let this new reality really sink in, and allow myself to be comforted.

Traditionally, the period of *aninut*, of “affliction” – that period subsequent to the death of a closely-related beloved, up until the burial – should be short, and one should not be doing what I am doing: working as if things were normal, trying to get tasks accomplished (other than the necessary tasks involved with dealing with the funeral home, rabbi, etc.). But, not having been born into a Jewish family, I am swimming in uncharted waters, with a long period of *aninut*, and with no anticipation of burial (my mother having chosen to be cremated). I want to observe as much of Jewish tradition related to death and mourning as I can, but I am in a kind of limbo, making up the rules as I go along. During this first week since my mother's death, I have come to understand the profound wisdom of having the funeral and burial quickly, and of having the mourner go home and simply sit with her sadness and with her memories, while she is comforted and surrounded by her community.

By the time you read this bulletin, I will have gotten up from *shiva*. But as I write today, the funeral has not yet taken place, and so I may be the first person in Jewish history to say “I am so looking forward to sitting *shiva*.” Strange but true. And from my past experiences with this community, I know you will be generous to overflowing with your kindness and caring, and thus I would like to *thank you all* in advance.

Unlike my father, who died unexpectedly in a plane crash, my mother knew she was dying. She had a rare form of cancer that she chose not to try to treat, but to submit to hospice and the care and love of her four children, her sons- and daughters-in-law, five grandchildren, and even a niece. I was blessed to be able to visit Mom for three extended periods in the last month and a half of her life, the last visit being the last five days of her life.

There were beautiful moments, and also very difficult, anguishing moments. I was so fortunate to have the support of Mark and Lev during one of these visits, and also of my amazing cousin Tracy (who has in the past year acted as hospice nurse to both her sister and mother). On my last visit to Mom, my brother Rob was there when I arrived, and my daughter Mira flew in from San Francisco; my youngest brother Jim was in and out several times a day, and he and his wife Roxanne took over the vigil when I left to return to Fall River (Mom died 12 hours later). During her last week of life, my mother, who had always been warm but also blunt and tough, showed us a vulnerable, “mushy” side that I had rarely, if ever, seen in her. She was so overcome that we had all gathered there, she kept saying “How can this be that you are all here? You have jobs...I don't deserve this!” And she quite uncharacteristically revealed her religious feelings, saying over and over, “Thank you God, thank you God!”

I don't think my mother was afraid of death; neither did she expect any “life in the world to come.” I think she expected to lose consciousness and to be returned to the elements (in her case, through fire), and yet she had faith in God's goodness. The phrase that we say about God every time we pray the *Amidah* comes to my mind: *who keeps faith with those who sleep in the dust*. Somehow, in a way that is beyond the capacity for our human reason to understand, some people do have this faith – that God is trustworthy, that Creation is good, that the natural limitation of any human lifespan (which necessarily includes our death) is part of the plan. Of course you would feel differently about the death of a young person, but my mom, who was 85 when she learned she had advanced cancer, felt she had lived a good, fulfilling life. She was grateful, and she was not afraid to die.

I can only say that I am in awe of my mother's spirit, and so thankful to have been raised by such a woman. And as I go through this life-passage, I am in awe as well of the wisdom of our Jewish traditions to help us deal with this inevitable event. We have an amazing spiritual technology that would be the envy of other faiths, and/or of those affiliated with no faiths, if they but understood how it syncs with the psychological and emotional needs of the bereft. I hope that I am not being *chutzpadik* in anticipating that this experience will help me to be more understanding towards others who are bereaved, to deepen my sensitivity to mourners. Once again, I want to thank you all for your support through this difficult time, as I remind myself that while we are here, we should thank the Blessed Holy One each day for the gift of life. *L'chayyim!*

I can't believe it is already summer! Honestly, the older I get, the faster time goes by. It really makes me stop and think about what is truly important in life, and the people who are most precious to us. Both Cantor Shoshana and I have recently lost our beloved mothers. Both were strong women who lived long, fulfilling lives, and both will be sorely missed by their families and friends. They will both live on through their children and grandchildren, and that is who we look to now as we continue to move forward, keeping the memories of our mothers deep in our hearts.

I know I speak for the entire congregation when I offer my sincere condolences to Cantor Shoshana, Rabbi Mark, Lev, Mira and the whole Brown family. I am also glad I had a chance to meet Pat, as she attended several functions while here visiting. I found her to be friendly, welcoming, and an independent spirit. Apparently the apple doesn't fall far from the tree, because I would also say all of those things about her daughter! May her memory be for a blessing.

As you can see on the cover, we have a lot going on this summer, so hold on to your bulletin, as the next one won't come out until the first of September. 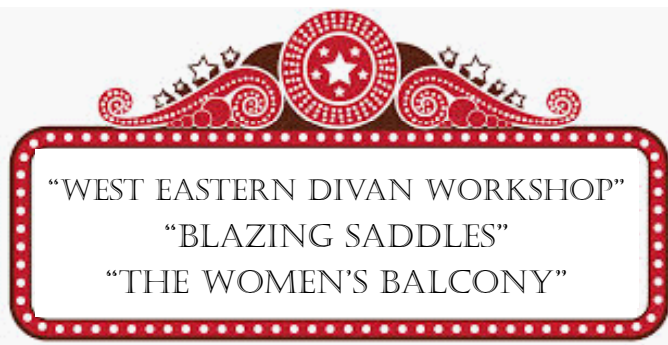

June 21st: Mystery Walk in Little Compton!

Congregant Anne Griffin, a resident of Little Compton, will lead us on her favorite local walk along the coastline of Little Compton. This is a rare opportunity, since many of the best spots in Little Compton are open to residents and their guests only.

July 19th: Westport Town Farm and Mill Pond Conservation Area: These two lovely spots in Westport are both near beautiful water views. The Town Farm is situated up a hill from the Westport River, and the Mill Pond Conservation Area (which features a small waterfall) is part of the Noquochoke River, which feeds into the Westport River. We will also stop to enjoy lunch or snacks at Westport's Head Town Landing Country Store.

August 23rd: Slocum's River Reserve: Slocum's River Reserve, in Dartmouth, is a property of the Trustees of Reservations & Dartmouth Natural Resources Trust. It boasts 2 miles of easy trails, many of them shaded, with views of Slocum's River. Afterwards, there may be a visit to Buzzards Bay Brewery, just up the road for locally-brewed beer and gourmet food trucks!
