A message from our Spiritual Leader, Cantor Shoshana Brown

The Homecoming at Temple Beth El

It is one day after Yom Kippur as I write these words, and I suppose I should feel exhausted, but actually I feel more full of energy than I did during the weeks leading up to the High Holidays. This might be explained by the sense of relief that the heavy lifting of these holidays is behind me, that the fast is over - and I can enjoy my coffee again, which I always cut down on during the week preceding the fast. But it is also because of the good feeling that is generated when so much of the Temple Beth El community comes together, many from far-flung places - it is a kind of "homecoming" season. It was especially gratifying to see a handful of our post b'nai mitzvah coming up to the Torah for aliyot, and a wonder to see how quickly they have grown up! I am happy to report that there were quite a few new people joining us for the first time, two of them women expecting their first children very soon - could there be a fresh infusion of children at Temple Beth El in our near future?

One of the new couples who were with us for the holidays shared with me how they met: they were both working and living at Camp Isabella Freedman (a Jewish retreat center) in the Connecticut Berkshires; and so I immediately knew that they must be knowledgeable, committed Jews. I was so happy that this young couple had chosen us! The husband remarked that although he had grown up in this part of New England, attending a Reform temple with his family, he now prefers a service with a greater balance of Hebrew in it, and that ours fit the bill for him. I'm sure that there might be some attendees who would say the opposite – you know the old story: two Jews, three opinions!

Certainly, one aspect of serving as a clergy person is recognizing that you can never please all the people all of the time – indeed, Rabbi Mark and I get great joy when it is evident that we have pleased some of the people at certain times – especially during these important holidays. But it is not just about us – we look out at the congregation during the holiday services, or across the vestry during the break-fast, and we see how much all of you are enjoying being together (and not only TBE members but members of Adas Israel as well), some of you reconnecting after not seeing each other since last Yom Kippur, and some of your friends who keep up regular contact throughout the year. In certain ways Rabbi Mark and I are outsiders to the Fall Riv-

er Jewish community - we cannot tell tales of "the good ol' days" of many decades ago at the temple. But in other ways we have been here long enough to feel the sense of *mishpocha* (family) in Jewish Fall River: we have gotten over our first years' jitters, and we can truly say that we now feel that all of you are family. In a family you don't all have to like the same things, or share the same opinions on everything (whether it be rituals, melodies, or politics): you just accept and embrace each other as you are, coming to one another's side during times of sadness or crisis, and rejoicing with one another during times of joy. We have been through sad times as well as joyful times with so many of you now. Seeing so many members of the TBE and Adas Israel mishpocha together over these holidays is an energizing force for me. Living in the era of much online interconnectedness but little face to face community, I feel that we are part of a very fortunate group who have retained this real human connectedness. I can only hope that we might be a vital rootstock out of which new shoots can grow and onto which new limbs can be grafted.

Our "homecoming" season extends through October, with our Simchat Torah celebration (and deli dinner) on October 1st, and the Ruderman Shabbaton-Weekend scheduled for October 19th to the 21st - and really on into December, with last year's marvelous Klezmer band, Ezekiel's Wheels, returning to play at our Chanukah party on December 9th. I know that some of you, alas, will leave us for warmer climes before December, but know that while you are away we will miss you and think of you, and look forward to your return in the spring. So I just want to say thank you to all of you who were here for the holidays, whether you played a vital role in the service or sponsored the break-fast, collected money for the flowers on the bimah, acted as an usher, chanted Torah, or just showed up there can be no community without people showing up: you are all vital to the continuation of Jewish life in greater Fall River. I look forward to seeing you again soon at our great line up of fall/winter events.

As they used to say at the end of every episode of *The Beverly Hillbillies*, "Y'all come back now, you hear?"


