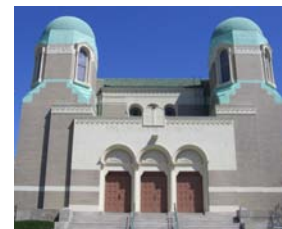

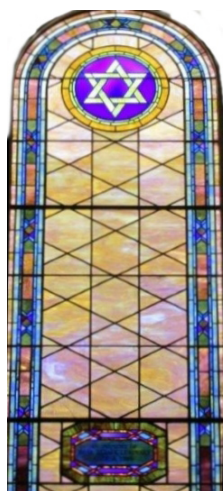

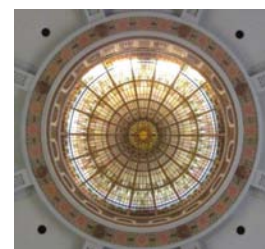

## A message from our Spiritual Leader, Cantor Shoshana Brown

### Turning, Re-turning, Making New and Finding “the Place Just Right”

*Hashiveinu Adonai elekha v'nashuvah: chadesh yameinu k'kedem!*

We sing these words at the close of every Torah service. They are very hard to translate, for they are expressive of a paradox, which I will do my best to render as follows:

*Return us to You, Adonai, and we will return: make new our days as in the beginning!*

At the first adult ed class under Rabbi Elber's and my leadership (on our first day of work, July 1st), we shared a little of our personal spiritual journeys, and asked members of the class to do the same. One theme emerged so clearly: person after person said, in one way or another, that Congregation Beth El was their **home**.

This indeed felt like the theme of our first month here, especially as Mark, Lev and I were settling into our new home on Walnut Street, just around the corner from TBE, making perhaps the most beautiful home that we have ever had. On Monday July 29th, many of you were present with us at our home to say the *brachah* (blessing) for putting up the beautiful *mezuzah* (which is a miniature likeness of TBE) on our front door, thus marking it as a *Jewish* home.

It seems that when we move, although everything is “new,” the “old” surfaces in new ways. We unpack boxes and discover black and white photographs of relatives from the Old Country whom we never had the chance to meet. I find new frames for them and places to hang them, and they preside in our home like revered guardians of the stairs and hallways. Discovering that the painter we had hired could also refinish furniture, I *finally* got our old dining room table refinished—the one that still had an old decal underneath of the “Green Lantern” comic book hero stuck there by my big brother! Sitting there, I am reminded of many family gatherings—and yet the table now looks “newer” and more beautiful than it ever did when I was a child.

Our house itself is old; built in 1886, it is older than the High Street temple. I love the old wood floors, the slight curvature in the stairs where so many feet have trod, and the smooth knobs at the end of the banister which so many hands have touched. And yet the house also feels new, having been renovated by its previous owners, who made it light and spacious, and added many attractive features that one would not typically find in a house of such vintage.

Which brings me to the task at hand at Temple Beth El. In being “called” by Congregation Beth El to become

your new spiritual leaders, the mandate (as I understand it) that the rabbi and I are being given is both to *turn back* and to *turn toward the future*, to *bring back* in some ways the glory and vitality that TBE showed in *the old days*, and to help the community discover *new, fresh* ways of doing things which can make our worship, our programs, and even our physical spaces more full of light, easier to move around in, more welcoming for a broad spectrum of Jews of all ages and at all levels of Hebrew-facility. How do you “modernize” an old home without sacrificing its character? How do you make Jewish worship accessible to all without diluting it of its majesty, its antiquity, its strong Jewish flavor? This is not an easy task, and so there will inevitably be some trial and error. And of course you can never please all the people all the time. Some of the tunes that I will be using for the *Yamim Noraim* (High Holy Days) might sound “new” to you, when in fact they are old Chasidic or even older Sefardi or Mizrahi (Middle Eastern) Jewish melodies. For the most part, I like to use easily-learnable melodies-- because I want you *all* to be singing with me. I believe that *prayer* is a natural *human* impulse—not something that should be left just to the rabbis and cantors!

We ask God to help us in our turning, or re-turning, for turning is not always easy. We want things to be new, fresh, vital—and yet we want them to be as they were “at the beginning.” This is the paradox of the Hebrew word **shanah**, which means not only **year** (as in Rosh ha-Shanah) but in its verbal form *to change, to repeat, to recite, and to learn*—all of these seemingly contradictory meanings! What might seem “new” to us might really be older than we can remember; what we think of as “old” might be relatively *new* in Jewish time; that which feels like a “change,” may actually be a *return* to the ways of our ancestors. In order to bring things back to the way they were “at the beginning,” we may have to do things in ways that they have never been done before; in order to re-new our Jewish life with integrity, it is helpful to mine our Jewish past.

I can't resist closing with the words of an “old” (non-Jewish) song—words from the Shaker hymn “Simple Gifts”:

‘Tis a gift to be simple, ‘tis a gift to be free  
‘Tis a gift to come down where we ought to be,  
And when we find ourselves in the place just right,  
‘Twill be in the valley of love and delight.  
When true simplicity is gained,  
To bow and to bend we shan't be ashamed,  
To turn, turn will be our delight,  
Till by turning and turning we come ‘round right.

On behalf of the rabbi, Lev, and myself, I want to wish you all a *Shanah tovah u-metukah*, a Good and Sweet New Year. May we all be written in the Book of Life for a Year of Health, Joy, Prosperity, and Fulfillment, each of us finding our “place just right.”
